





2023 EMERALD LEADER MARY BETH O'NEILL






FINANCIALS

For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, support for Leadership Geauga continued the positive trend of recent years. Financial management of Leadership Geauga is provided by the Board of Directors and its Finance Committee.




